Recent events

19 June 2015 – **GDFT Primary Academy Indoor Athletics Event** (Year 5/6)
(Braunstone Leisure Centre, Leicester)

Impact – The opportunity for pupils to compete in the equivalent to a national competition with over 500 participants. Pupils enhance their understanding and life experiences by competing and socialising with children from a variety of diverse cultural backgrounds. Furthermore, huge emphasis is placed on the difference in attitudes and aspirations of children from inner cities in comparison to other regions, coupled with aspects of self-motivation, teamwork and resilience.

10th July 2015- **Kings for Gold 2015** (Years R-6)

Impact-1st Place out of 9 schools in the Kingsthorpe cluster.

The opportunity for pupils to compete in competition with participants from cluster schools. Pupils enhance their understanding and life experiences by competing and socialising with children from a variety of backgrounds. Furthermore, huge emphasis is placed on the difference in attitudes and aspirations of children from inner cities in comparison to other regions, coupled with aspects of self-motivation, teamwork and resilience.

Specialist PE teachers from the Weston Favell Academy work each week with pupils and share their specialist knowledge with teachers. This acts as a mentoring mechanism and helps to improve the quality and breadth of teaching with primary staff feeling more confident in their PE delivery. This has increased pupils' understanding of the benefits of physical exercise and participation rates in sporting activities. A growing enthusiasm for PE is evident and is directly related to the increase in competitive opportunities and variety of sports on offer. The wide range of expertise made available through Weston Favell Academy PE staff has a direct impact on the enrichment of both the PE and afterschool curriculum.

Impact – Being able to utilise the expertise of outside providers (Back of the Net, Hotshots) and staff has enabled the Academy to offer additional afterschool sporting clubs. These are accessible to boys and girls in a range of year groups. This has provided enriched opportunities for the children.

Swimming provision

Barry Road Swimming pool (Year 4/5/6) 6 x 1 hour sessions

Impact – All Year 4/5/6 within the Academy receive swimming tuition from specialist swimming teachers/instructors. Each year group from 4-6 has a minimum of 6 weeks swimming. All pupils are working towards the NC recommendation to:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of 25m.
- Use a range of strokes effectively
- Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations

The Academy regards swimming as an essential life skill. Very few of our children go to swimming lessons outside school. This can be evidenced by the number of children who are non-swimmers at their first lesson.

Training Days – GDFT Central training days

The PE coordinator has attended three training days on OAA, Inclusion in PE, assessing in PE, curriculum planning and Gifted and Talented. 3 members of staff attended Energy Club training. These will be implemented into the curriculum.

PE coordinator has had additional training on PE policies and practise provided by Jane Banham. Lunchtime Supervisors had training on Active Playgrounds. Teaching staff had training on OAA.

Impact – The PE coordinator has attended these training days and has then disseminated this information to colleagues throughout the Academy. Staff feel more confident in their delivery and have a greater understanding of all aspects of PE. Gifted and Talented pupils are continually challenged and assessments are accurate through robust moderation.

CfBT bespoke training – GDFT

June 2015 – Whole staff training on practical OAA

Impact – All members of the teaching and support staff develop their knowledge and understanding of OAA. They will consider the key factors of a good OAA lesson, review the quality of their own teaching and learning and identify practical teaching and learning strategies to develop high challenge for pupils of all abilities. New skills can be embedded in the PE curriculum, ensuring a holistic approach towards the delivery of OAA in all year groups. Subsequently, the teamwork and communication element of OAA can be applied to PE lessons throughout all year groups.

Termly PE KIT meetings with all other GDFT PE coordinators – ongoing

Impact – The opportunity to share good practice by discussing ideas and creating new initiatives with other GDFT PE colleagues throughout the Trust. Sharing of resources and a shared commitment to generating higher standards of physical education within the Academy.
